Cas Weykamp

Cas Weykamp is a clinical chemist and director of the MCA laboratory of the Queen Beatrix Hospital in the city of Winterswijk, the Netherlands. A major activity is the standardization of HbA1c. He is network coordinator of the worldwide network of 16 reference laboratories operating the IFCC reference method for HbA1c and member of the IFCC Committee on Education Use of Biomarkers Diabetes. As such he has a close working relation with Garry John. He is also advisor of the NGSP. In the Netherlands he coordinates many EQA programmes on behalf of SKML, the national EQA organiser. One of his major EQA programmes is on HbA1c, his hobby horse and subject of his PhD Study. In general he is active in the field of EQA/PT, Standardization and Harmonization as member of the IFCC Task Force for Proficiency Testing and the IFCC Working Groups on Commutability and CDT. In the AACC he served as chair of the task force to develop tools for the AACC Harmonization Initiative. He is speaker at many international scientific meetings. Martin is a Consultant Clinical Biochemist at Lancashire Teaching Hospitals. He has led a continuous program of Pathology re-design, improving the clinical and operational effectiveness of Pathology delivery whilst improving productivity. She is the current chair of the International Federation of Clinical Chemistry and Laboratory Medicine (IFCC) Committee on Analytical Quality and is a member of the European Federation in Laboratory Medicine Working Group on Performance Specifications for EQAS.

She has previously held posts on the Executive Board of the European Committee for External Quality Assurance Programmes in Laboratory Medicine, chair of the All Wales Clinical Biochemistry Group, chair of the National Clinical Biochemistry and Laboratory Medicine Audit Committee in the UK, a member of the Association of Clinical Biochemistry and Laboratory Medicine Scientific Committee and a member of the Royal College of Pathologists Scientific Advisory Committee on Clinical Biochemistry. In 2019, EQALM honoured Annette by presenting her with the Adam Uldall award for the work she has done in the field of EQA. Annette was also awarded the Welsh Government Lifetime Achievement Award at the Advancing Healthcare Awards 2019.

Professor Bill Fraser was born and educated in Glasgow, graduating from Glasgow University with BSc (Hons), MBChB and MD (Hons). He trained in Glasgow's teaching hospitals acquiring MRCPath (now FRCPath) and MRCP (now FRCP) before spending time as a consultant/travelling fellow in Canada.

In 1991 he was appointed Senior Lecturer in Chemical Pathology and Head of the Metabolic Bone Disease Unit at the Royal Liverpool University Hospital, promoted to Reader in 1998, Professor in 2001, Head of the Unit of Clinical Chemistry in 2008, and Head of Department of Musculoskeletal Biology in 2010. He was Director of the Masters in Research for Clinical Science from August 2008. He was appointed Professor of Medicine at Norwich Medical School, University of East Anglia in May 2011, Head of Department of Medicine in 2012, Sub Dean of the Medical School in 2016 and Dean in March 2018.

Bill supervises a very active research group investigating the diagnosis and treatment of metabolic bone disease including osteoporosis, Paget's Disease of Bone and rare bone tumours. He is on the Editorial Board of several journals, a Director of the Supra Regional Assay Service for bone metabolism and calcium homeostasis, a Trustee of the Paget's Association, Trustee of Action Arthritis and a Medical Advisor to the National Osteoporosis Society. He was a previous recipient of the ACB Foundation Award, presenter of the John Ireland Lecture and the Albert Latner Memorial Lecture in 2017.


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
